### Fall endurance run by Deb G.

Four Brandywine HOG members (Bernie & Debbie G. and Mac & Joanne M.) completed one heck of an endurance ride in mid-October.

**Day 1-** We started our trek with KSU at 5:30 am on Thursday, October 12<sup>th</sup> in Downingtown, PA. We traveled through PA, OH, IN, and landed in Saginaw, MI for the evening. 692 miles.



Day 3 - October 14th started early with KSU 6:45 am. We rode west through the UP of Michigan until we hit Duluth, MN, and then headed up along the North Shore of Lake Superior. Sixty miles north of Duluth, we stopped at Split Rock Lighthouse for the HD 50 Rides 1 Nation in Minnesota. By now it was lunchtime and we had an important decision to make. Stop at Subway for lunch & chit chat OR eat a few protein bars and hightail it to Chippewa Falls HD (200 miles away and closing at 4 pm). When you see Bernie or Mac in a new Chippewa Falls tshirt, you'll know the decision. After leaving the dealership, we headed to the H.O.G. crossroads in Globe, WI, a HD 10 Rides for '23 destination. We continued south to spend the night at Wisconsin Dells, WI. 625 miles.



Day 2 - October 13th started early with breakfast which included the yummy cinnamon buns at the Holiday Inn Express. KSU by 6:30 am and headed northwest through the Tunnel of Trees, H-D 50 Rides 1 Nation site for Michigan, which runs along the coast of Lake Michigan. We crossed over the Mackinac Bridge, with Lake Michigan to the left and Lake Huron to the right, into the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. We rode for the rest of the day along the north coast of Lake Michigan and through the beautiful fall foliage of the UP. Our day ended in Iron River, MI. We skirted the drizzle for most of the day and only had one close call with a deer. 500 miles.



Day 4 - October 15<sup>th</sup> started early with KSU 6:30 am. We headed south through Wisconsin and farmlands of Illinois. So many windmill fields! Felt like we were in a sci-fi movie. 
