Well done Brandywine HOG! The amount of miles ridden by our chapter in 2022 was a fantastic accomplishment. Last year we had 42 members sign up and get their mileage recorded through the National HOG Ride 365 program. HOG and our dealership keep the the mileage records for each rider who signs up. All members can see this information at members.hog.com.

The following is a summary of the standings.

National total - we ranked # 33 with a total of 521,478 miles for the year.

National Average per rider - we ranked # 11 with an average of 12,478 miles per member. For the Northeast Region we ranked #2 with the 521,478 total miles.

Five Key Points to Safe Riding

Assume you are invisible to other drivers.

Don't ever assume another driver knows you're there. Adhere to the attitude that no one else on the road is concerned with your personal safety. Learn to use a riding strategy like SEE (search, evaluate, execute) to manage the roadway and traffic.

Look where you want to go.

It's called visual directional control. Keep your head and eyes oriented 3-4 seconds ahead of you when cornering. In an emergency, do not stare at the guardrail, the gravel shoulder or the oncoming car — chances are you'll hit whatever you're trying to avoid. (The term for this is target fixation.)

Countersteer.

Use precise inputs to the handgrips, not body lean, to lean the motorcycle. When you countersteer, you initially turn the handlebars in the opposite direction you think you should. Press forward on the right handgrip, the bike leans right. Press forward on the left handgrip, the bike leans left. (Note: countersteering is not how you turn a motorcycle; it's how you lean a motorcycle.)

Use both brakes.

Your front brake provides 70 percent or more of your stopping power in an emergency. Squeeze, do not grab, the front brake, and keep squeezing, increasing the squeezing pressure until you've slowed sufficiently or stopped. Untrained riders are often afraid to use the front brake for fear of flipping over. Trained riders know better.

Never stop riding the bike.

Don't ever give up control of your motorcycle. "Laying it down" is not a strategy. The person with the most control of any situation is you. Look where you want to go, countersteer or use maximum braking to avoid a crash.



Here's the information that Joe shared at our chapter meeting about the Road Warrior Program

- This program is designed to encourage participation in the Brandywine H.O.G. chapter events.
- The threshold level of 1,000 points is designed so that any active member could earn a Road Warrior patch in any given year.
- So, this is very easily attainable... you just have to get out and ride, participate, and come to meetings.
- The Road Warrior Point's Coordinator will maintain the points.
- At each chapter meeting, ride, or event, there will be a sign-in sheet used in tracking and tabulating the Road Warrior points.
- It will be your individual responsibility to submit your points for those items not recorded on a sign-in sheet or mileage milestones on a timely basis to the Road Warrior Points Coordinator (prior to close of quarter in which the activity occurred).
- However, it is the responsibility of each member to check in with the point's coordinator to make sure their points are accurate and up to par.... The point coordinator will produce the points for a quarter at the next meeting after the quarter ends. The membership should review the points & any questions need to be raised prior to or at following meeting. If nothing stated, then those points are considered accurate.
- Any member that reaches 1000 points will be awarded a Road Warrior patch as well as the year patch. In subsequent years, the member will receive just the current year patch.
- The member with the most points for the current year will receive their name on the Road Warrior plaque with the year achieved.
- You must be a member of Brandywine HOG at the time of the event to receive the points.

Points per event description

- All points are reset Jan 1st every year
- 250 Completion of 25,000 Miles *
- 200 Completion of 20,000 Miles *
- 150 Completion of 15,000 Miles *
- 100 Completion of 10,000 Miles *
- 50 Completion of 5,000 Miles *
- 10 Completion of 1,000 Miles *
- 100 Completion of Rider Safety Course (in Current year)
- 100 Recruit a new member for Brandywine Chapter
- 100 Work at Brandywine H.O.G. special event (Dam Ride, Grill and Chill meet and greet etc.:)
- 50 Brandywine Chapter Lead or Sweep (per ride worked)
- 50 Write a news article that is published in the Brandywine H.O.G. 8249 Newsletter (except articles that are a necessary part of officer position such as announcements/ chapter business)
- 50 Donate a raffle prize to Brandywine HOG
- 50 Brandywine HOG Chapter Membership Enrollment received by January's meeting each year (except this year as new Program so must be received by Feb Meeting)
- 50 Attend Brandywine H.O.G. meetings,
- 20 Participating in Brandywine H.O.G. rides (not included if Leading or Sweeping for a ride because you will receive the points for that instead)

Mileage Footnote

*All Mileage information will come from the Harley Davidson Ride 365 program under the Brandywine Chapter. They will be the miles ridden & logged for the current year. You will receive the points for each milestone that you reach during the year. So, if you record 5,000 miles, you will receive 60 points (10 for the 1,000 milestone & 50 for the 5,000 milestone). If you record 2,500 miles., you will receive 10 points for reaching the 1,000 miles milestone. If you record 25,000 miles or more, you will receive 760 points. These points will be accounted for after the 1st of the next year when Ride 365 is finalized.
